Position Announcement: Environmental Studies - Economics

Bethune-Cookman University is looking for an Environmental Studies faculty member at the Assistant or Associate Professor level to join the rapidly developing Department of Integrated Environmental Science. We are looking for a colleague who possesses a thorough grounding in social aspects of environmental and/or sustainability issues and who is capable of working in a true interdisciplinary department focusing on integrated approaches to addressing coastal and aquatic environmental issues. While we are open to a range of specializations, we would prefer for this person to have some background in environmental microeconomics involving issues of resource depletion and pollution, as well as the application of macroeconomics to sustainable development and the choice of policy instruments. In addition, we would prefer:

- 1) Ph.D. or equivalent degree in Environmental Studies, Economics, or related field with a familiarity with ecological economics, with particular reference to the role of thermodynamics, environmental accounting (input-output analysis), the limits to markets, and/or environmental governance (national and international), particularly as applied to coastal environmental issues such as biodiversity loss and climate change
- 2) An established teaching (Bachelor's and Master's), research/publication, and funding record (or evidence of promise thereof) with connection to environmental issues (salary and rank to be based on experience and record)

IES is an interdisciplinary department offering both Bachelor's and Master's degrees, and faculty members in IES have both teaching and research expectations. Preference will be given to candidates who can demonstrate an ability to contribute to, cooperate with, and enhance the work of faculty with many different scientific and non-scientific specializations.
